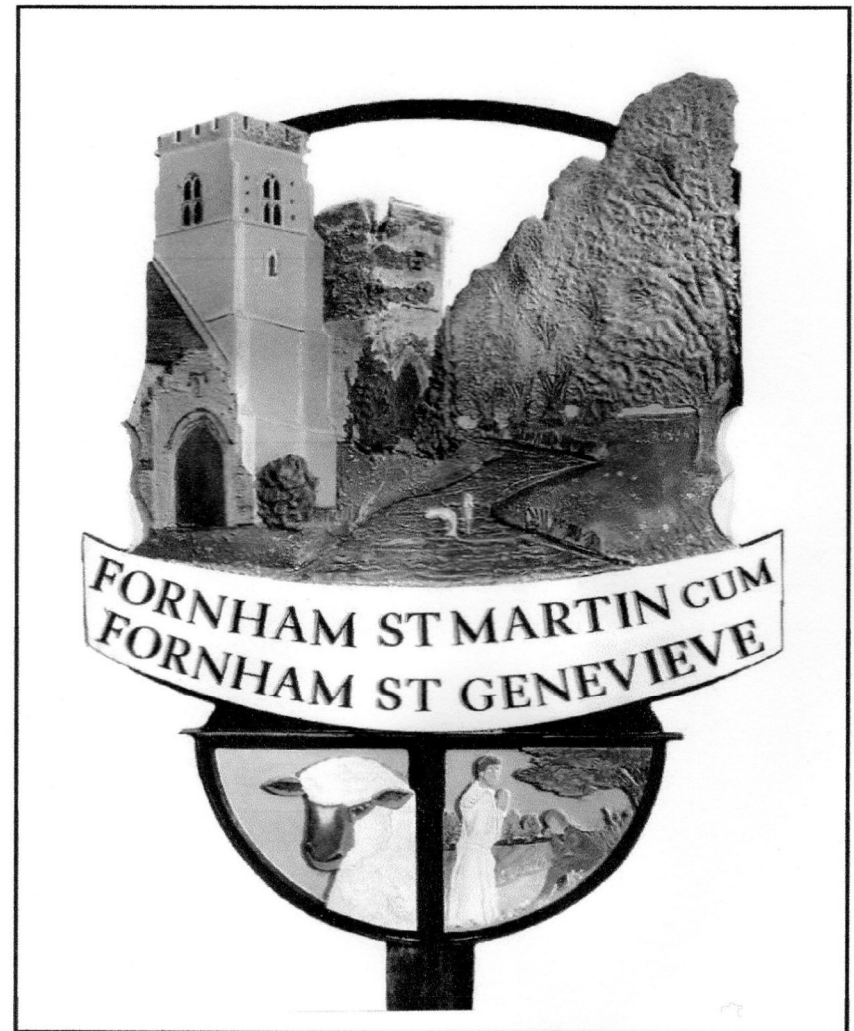

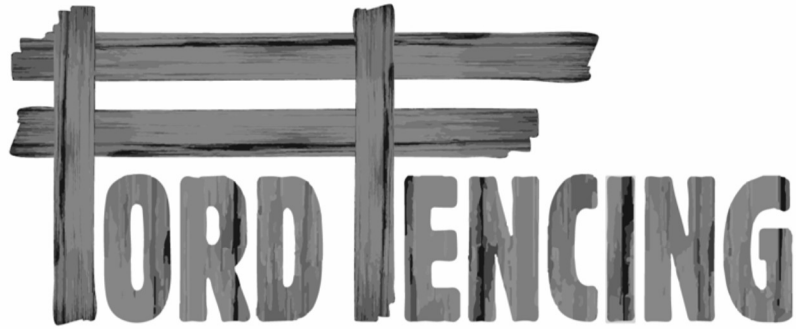

All offers of help distributing and collecting the red envelopes will be appreciated. George Jones [729148] would also like to hear from people in the Western zone of Lark Valley. Christian Aid nationally and locally are also organising other fund raising events, both at this time, and throughout the year, but this annual envelope collection still raises a huge amount, for those desperately in need of help, just being able to grow enough food to stay alive in many cases. Some will not, unless Christian Aid provides the means, equipment and support so they can feed themselves.

Fund raising for the Bells and Tower Project is going nice and steady, with grateful thanks to all the personal donations over the last few months, and grant applications continue, with some already making offers. We are now making initial arrangements to have some preparatory works done in the tower in preparation for lowering the 6 bells, so they can be restored and tuned.

On 12 March we laid to rest the ashes of Edna Mary Williams, age 97, in the existing grave of her Mother, Edith Steward (1980) attended by her cousin Janet Taylor with husband Colin. This following the recent cremation service by Revd Sylvia. Edna was a long-time resident in FSM, living in Flint Cottages and Park Avenue, until the last few years at a care home in Sudbury, and is still remembered by some residents. She was awarded a British Empire Medal for her services to the community.

We have also just heard of the sad sudden death of George Manning. George has lived with wife Muriel in one of the cottages on Hall Farm for many years, whilst working on the farm. Cllr. Hopfensperger gave an update on the B1106 Culford Junction & bend; Highways are to renew the white lining & SLOW signs, and will be redoing the Chevrons to make them larger, spread out over the bend, to make them more visible, the warning bend signs will be improved, there is to be an Advisory 30mph speed on both directions, they are to approach landowners to address overgrown vegetation and will be contacting local businesses to remove unnecessary signage. There is no timeframe for these works yet, but Cllr. Hopfensperger is going to ask them to look at road surface at the same time.

Highways & Footpaths:

To Discuss Costs to add new 30mph Roundels on the carriageway at Barton Hill

Cllr. Stennett advised he had received a quote from Highways to replace the 30mph roundels on Barton Hill; totaling £519.95. Stennett's have kindly offered to sponsor the project and pay the costs.

It was agreed to proceed.

Lark valley Trees / Footpath Update

Cllr. Hopfensperger advised that an Engineer is going to go out and inspect the footpaths.

Flooding Barton Hill (BMW Garage & Russell Baron Road)

Cllr. Hopfensperger advised that the Drainage Team are going to go out and inspect the flooding at the BMW Garage.

Cllr. Hopfensperger confirmed that the gullies were cleared and the ditch/grips were dug out in January 2020. This has not helped the flooding on Barton Hill (Bus Stop at bottom of hill) and as such Cllr. Hopfensperger is going to follow this up with the drainage team.

Cllr. Hopfensperger advised that the flooding on Russell Baron Road is to be inspected by the Engineer when they inspect the footpaths in Lark Valley Drive.

The Clerk is to report online the flooding on the B1106, Fornham Park side, between the Stennett's and Fornham Park and also opposite Parklands Green, which is affecting the lay-by and footpath. The Clerk will then forward the reference numbers to Cllr. Hopfensperger for her to follow up.

Update on Surfacing/Skirting Works – The Street, FSG & Street Sweeping Update

Cllr. Hopfensperger has chased up Mark Walsh and is awaiting a timeframe for the skirting works to be completed from the roundabout (FAS), around the bend and down the Street. FSG.

Cllr. Hopfensperger is to ask the Engineer to inspect the footpaths in Parklands Green at the same time as the footpaths in Lark Valley Drive are to be inspected, to address the erosion and moss.

Cllr. Hopfensperger advised that the road sweeper has now been out in the village several times recently, our thanks were expressed to Cllr. Hopfensperger for her help. Cllr. Hopfensperger is to try and get the street sweeper out to do the paths on The Street.

Parish Matters:

Eco Initiatives for the King George Playing Field Update

The Chairman confirmed that 24 trees were planted around the edge of the playing field on Saturday. Several volunteers were present and the planting went well. The Clerk is to approach David Randall regarding watering the trees from end of March onwards.

The next phase of the project, to include wild flowerbeds, a Nature Trail with signage, bird/bat/owl boxes, insect hotels and hedgehog homes, is to be arranged in the Spring, date TBC. Thanks were given to Cllr. Hopfensperger and Cllr. Broughton for their grant from their Locality which is helping to pay for the Eco Initiatives.

The Clerk confirmed that the new Defibrillator had now been installed and set up and the Insurance had paid in full. The loan unit is being collected tomorrow. If anyone is interested in being a back-up caretaker, please contact the Clerk.

ELDERBURY SOCIAL CLUB

In February Christine Humphries came to talk to us about John Craske a fisherman who 'painted' in wool, a, strange media but it made for some remarkable pictures. He was born in 1881 into a fishing family in Sheringham. He belonged to the Salvation Army. He suffered poor health and was later confined to a wheelchair. To relieve his boredom his wife found some wool and showed John the way to fill in a picture. His paintings were seen by some Americans who purchased several of them to take back to the USA. There are many of his paintings to be seen in the Sheringham Museum, they can also be seen in the Britten Pears foundation in Aldeburgh. During the last years of his life he was increasingly bedridden. He listened on his radio to the news of the evacuation of Dunkirk, this inspired him to make two very depictive pictures of the scene; altogether a remarkable man and an interesting afternoon.

In March our chairman told us of the history of the Fornhams. People were living here 25 to 30,000 years ago. The settlements were gradually overrun by invaders from the East. Buildings were made of wood and thatch. By the time the Romans invaded there was trade with Europe and stone was being transported down the river Lark. By 900 AD there were 7 kingdoms in England. The stone for the Saxon church at Fornham All Saints would have been brought there on the river. Churches built on Saxon remains between 1430 and 1450 would have had thatched roofs. The Guildhall in Fornham St Martin is probably its oldest building.

Tollgate Junction Consultation


Residents may be aware that some major plans to change the configuration of the gyratory system at the Tollgate junction are going through a consultation process currently, to decide what is the best design that will ease current and future congestion, taking into account the planned expansion of various Housing Developments in the area.

Your Parish Council is of the firm opinion that the main part of the problem causing congestion is the junction at Station Hill and the zebra crossing that was reduced to one lane some time ago. Many of you who use that route will know exactly what we mean. Your Council feels that to spend upwards of £800,000 on reconfiguring the gyratory will be ineffective if the root cause of congestion at Station Hill is not dealt with.

We as a Parish Council have drawn up our suggestions for a new layout that we believe will be cheaper than the three plans under consultation and will free up monies to pay for improvements at Station Hill.

We have sent our thoughts and plans to surrounding Parish Councils in the fond hope they will agree the plans and support our efforts to convince the County. We will also send copies to Ward Councillors and to Andrew Reid who is the Portfolio Holder of Road and Transport for the County in the hope that proper consideration is given to the issue.

The talk at the February meeting of the Fornham Ladies was a very topical one. Ian Miles spoke on Climate Change. He began by explaining the world situation, and how it would affect our grandchildren. He showed graphs of how global warming has increased since the industrial revolution. Cars etc, he said, contribute to high emissions. Ian went on to warn that global warming will destroy many parts of the world affecting ecology. He then went on to show how one can help the environment. Saving water, using less plastic, and recycling. Charity shops are a good way to recycle clothes. Using a full load when washing or dishwashing. Using public transport, and using glass bottles instead of plastic.

The talk at the next meeting March 18th, is entitled 'Fat Bird and a Boat'

GARDEN CLUB

Our speaker in February was Matt Tanton-Brown (www.placeforplants.co.uk) who delivered a very entertaining talk on "Plants for Problem Places" – an issue with which all gardeners can identify!! Matt focused on plants for 3 trouble spots, illustrating his talk with numerous plants plus cultivation advice. Recommendations, to name but a few, were: 1) heavy clay (wet and damp areas): choisya, philadelphus, arbutus (a particularly hardy plant), heathers, grasses, willows and flowering currants; 2) sandy (dry and hot-baked): Cornus sanguinea "Midwinter fire", Daphne x transatlantica "Pink fragrance", berberis, Corokia x virgate "Red wonder" and winter-flowering honeysuckle; 3) cold, exposed areas: podocarpus, Japanese cherry tree "Kojo-no-mai", liriope, privet, hellebores, Euphorbia amygdaloides, Japanese spotted laurel and sarcococca. We had ample opportunity to purchase many of the above plants at the end of the meeting.

On 10 March we were delighted to welcome Robert Brett, curator of RHS Hyde Hall with over 30 years' experience in horticulture, who came to talk about "Changing the World Through Plants". The focus of his talk was the importance of reconnecting with the environment and, if possible, how to marry the need for development whilst avoiding destructive activity. He gave examples of how, at the local level, groups can make a difference by developing community gardens, particularly in inner cities where they often provide the only available outdoor space. Apparently, the Botanic Garden in Brooklyn, NY was the first to have a children only area: adults only allowed in with the permission of the youngsters! We heard about the RHS (www.rhs.org.uk), its gardens, outreach work (eg, Young School Gardener of the Year and Britain in Bloom) and support of apprenticeship programmes. However, much of the talk centred on the Eden Project in Cornwall (www.edenproject.com), with its multitude of transformational ecology, community and educational projects on- and off-site. Originally a china clay pit, work began in the mid-1990's to transform the area into the world-famous attraction (albeit with a very serious message) it is today. We heard about the iconic biomes housing plants from the world's rainforest environments (Rainforest Biome) and temperate landscapes of the Mediterranean, South Africa and Western Australia (Mediterranean Biome), as well as the large swathes of monoculture planting outside of sunflowers, barley and hemp covering the terraced landscape. There is
