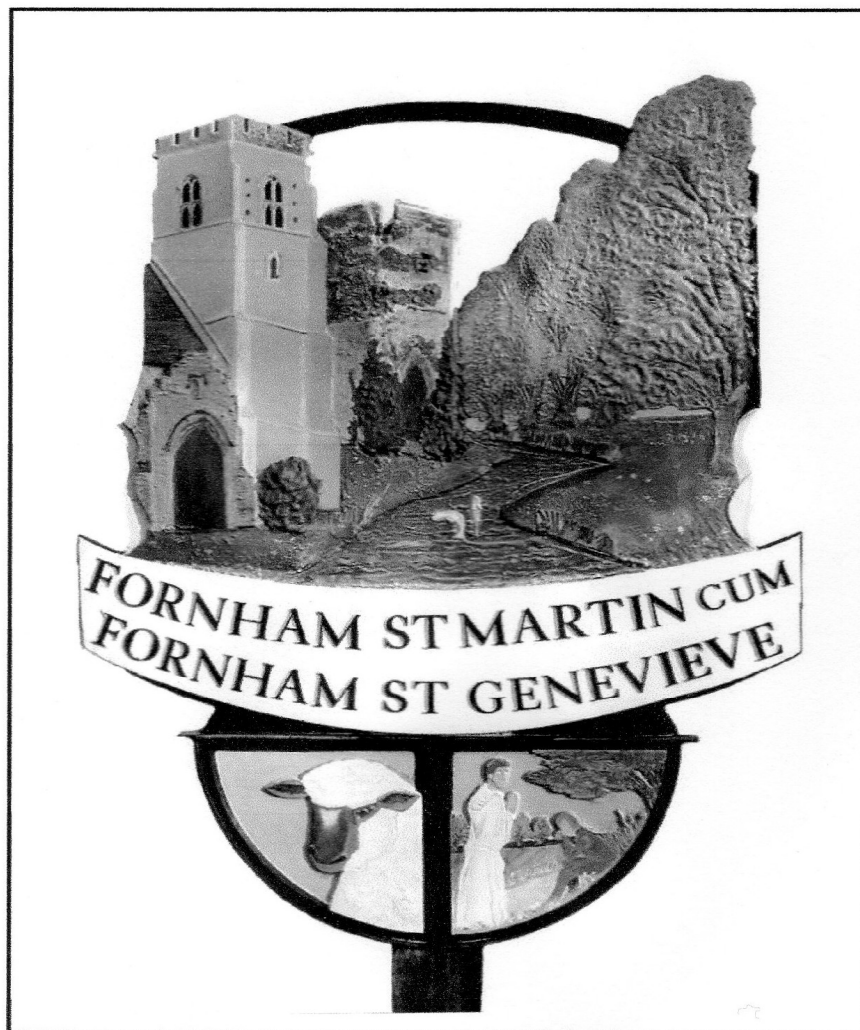

VILLAGE HALL

The Village Hall Management Committee really do need new members, both from the local community and as representatives from the Groups who use the Hall. After many years of service some of the Committee are now taking a well deserved rest.

There are many things which Committee Members and volunteers could do in order to make savings, such as helping to decorate the interior of the hall or keeping weeds at bay in the garden. The time commitment would only be a few hours a year. So, if you have energy and enthusiasm and would like to share your skills, then we would love to hear from you.

At the moment the Committee is made up of: –

(Treasurer)

Representatives of Groups – Barbara Hill (Garden and retiring Chairman), Jean Cook (Mother and Toddlers) and Maureen Hockett (Ladies), together with Margaret Ade (Church, retiring) and Gary Hubbard of the Parish Council.

We meet at least three times a year with an AGM in April.

The building, which we now use as the Village Hall, has been a part of the village for over a hundred years and needs the local community to look after its fabric and facilities. The Hall is very well used as we have many Groups who book on a regular basis, as well as bookings for private parties.

Our Hall Manager, Colleen Leach, looks after the bookings and keeps the Hall looking immaculate. We have recently appointed Brian Swan as our Maintenance person to look after the various small but important jobs which arise from time to time and he also takes on the role of relief Hall Manager.

This year we have decided to improve the facilities of the Hall by putting in a new kitchen and upgrading the toilets. We now have a modern kitchen and a Unisex Accessible Toilet/Gents together with a nappy changing facility as well as a refurbished ladies toilet. Paul Mullen, a skilled carpenter and local resident, has undertaken the Project Management and much of the work, together with other local skilled craftsmen. Jim Grant, plumber, has guided us in the installation of an Accessible Toilet. We very much appreciate the hours Paul, Jim and others have given to the improvements to the Hall both now and in the past.

A contribution to the funding of the Accessible Toilet and ramp (next step) has been made by Councillor Rebecca Hopfensperger from her Locality Budget at Suffolk County Council, and we thank her for this support.

1. APOLOGIES

Councillor M Collier.

2. APPROVE MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 18th JULY 2013

The minutes were signed as being a true record.

The Council adjourned.

3. WELCOME COUNCILLOR HOWARD QUAYLE (FAS)

The Chairman welcomed Councillor Quayle (Chairman Fornham All Saints Parish Council)

Councillor Quayle said much of his time was being taken up with Bury North West development and told the meeting that the Secretary of State has said he is not happy about the increased

traffic in and around Bury which will be greatly affected by the new 900 housing site.

Councillor Quayle said that All Saints had become concerned about speeding traffic and had pressed SCC to do something about it but in the absence of any progress, they decided to “go it alone” and purchase and manage a flashing sign themselves. The cost of which amounted to £2,800 and was purchased from Westcotec of Dereham. This included a spare battery and two battery chargers. They have identified various sites throughout All Saints, opposite the Community Centre, Tutt Hill opposite the fish farm, in the main street near the Church and the old post office, Mildenhall Road and near the lock bridge, making 8 locations in all. They purchased clips for supporting the device on the posts. In some cases they have utilised existing posts but where necessary they have erected new posts. Councillor Quayle said the device can be handled by one person but where it is sited in a higher position, one would need to use a step ladder. For maximum security they have two combination locks, one to secure the workings of the device and the other to secure it to the post. The limits which can be set are 20mph, 30mph and 40mph and there is an in-built test facility and a counter registers the number of infringements. It is intended that they will have an additional sign adjacent to Pigeon Lane which is being funded by a developer and will form part of the planning approval. Councillor Quayle said that at present he and one other councillor take it in turns to move the sign on a weekly basis but it is envisaged that all councillors will have a hand in this weekly procedure.

A deal of data has already been collected which indicates that 8000 infringements (one way) occurred in one week along the piece of road from Tutt Hill to the Village. From all the other data, it was seen that approximately 40% of traffic exceeded the speed limit of 30mph.

Countryside Properties had recorded 71,000 vehicles (both directions) along Tutt Hill in the course of a week. Councillor Butler said that in the light of this information much more information

relating to traffic impact needs to be gathered. Councillor Quayle said that the enhanced version of the device could have its data dumped on to a CD. He said that the police have increased their presence in the early evening on Tutt Hill.

Councillor Hubbard asked if permission was required to site the sign from SCC. They do have to be consulted as to the position. Asked about the batteries, Councillor Quayle said that, in normal use, the batteries hold charge for a week. There is a fail safe so as to protect the batteries as they shut down when the reading reaches 10.8 and when fully charged is 12.7. Councillor Butler said our preference was for permanent signs and the mobile ones were "second best"

Councillor Quayle said that 50,000 vehicles per week (both ways) were recorded using Mildenhall Road and here too, 40% were exceeding the speed limit. Councillor Quayle said the Highways Agency had yet to sign off the Bury North West scheme. He said that there was strong support for the change in the Tutt Hill road which may well become a cul-de-sac in about 10 years time. The Chairman thanked Councillor Quayle for attending the meeting and for giving so much valuable information and advice.

4. POLICE REPORT

PCSO Hollie Cogman said there had been one crime which was the theft on August 12th/13th of an oil tank which was awaiting fitting from a private dwelling.

She drew attention to recent thefts of high value road bicycles and asked people to be vigilant.

The police speed board had been deployed on Barton Hill twice in August and twice in the Street. In August 4 people had been given verbal warnings and in September there had been 8 offences which resulted in two tickets being issued, one verbal warning and five community speed watch letters.

On the Russell Baron Road issue regarding dangerous parking, PCSO Ruston has been and will continue to monitor the situation. A written complaint was handed to PCSO Cogman for investigation. Councillor Youngs said he has received complaints

about speeding in Russell Baron Road.

The Chairman thanked the PCSO for attending and for her report and assistance.

5. BOROUGH/COUNTY COUNCILOR'S REPORT

Councillor Hopfensperger was able to report that the location for the VAS signs had been agreed by SCC and the posts would be erected next week. Councillors were pleased, that after such a lengthy wait, things appeared to be moving. The locations were – West of the golf club, The Street adjacent to Holly Lodge, Culford Road and Barton Hill.

On footpath widening, Councillor Hopfensperger said a decision on funding should be made by the end of September and she has been pressing the case on behalf of the Parish Council.

Councillor Butler said that a pedestrian had been knocked over on the path by a cyclist which resulted in the walker suffering a broken arm. Councillor Butler said in the past we had been refused a risk assessment on the path and this incident highlighted the need for the assessment and for the path to be widened. Councillors concurred.

Councillor Hopfensperger said SCC were currently cracking down on fly tipping which is costing £265k to clear up.

She asked if it would be possible to highlight the issue of free school meals in the Bugle as 5000 children in Suffolk who are eligible are not claiming. There is £5million in the fund for this purpose. If anyone wishes to claim, they contact the school. Councillor Hopfensperger spoke about the meeting shortly coming up on home care and about the recent GCSE A+ levels.

Asked if more labour could be assigned to the lock bridge works, Councillor Hopfensperger said she thought that this would not be possible.

From the floor she was asked about the Tutt Hill development and the logistics. Councillor Hopfensperger said she was pressing

very strongly for the complete road system to be in place before any development takes place.

The Chairman thanked Councillor Hopfensperger for her report and for her attendance.

6. AGENDA ITEMS OF INTEREST TO THE PUBLIC

From the floor Mr Owen wished to comment on the planning application SE/13/0934, Holly Lodge, The Street. He gave details of his concerns which he had been discussing with the applicant.

Councillors would take into consideration his comments.

From the floor, the issue of the memorial tree for the late Ethel Fordham was discussed. The proposal was for one maple tree. After some discussion it was agreed that the planting could go ahead as per the plan which was near the children's play area.

The issue of the proposed additional dog bin was called into question. The Chairman said that this was not on the agenda but reiterated that this item was on hold.

The Council reconvened

7. DECLARATION OF INTEREST – None

8. MATTERS ARISING

a. Speeding on the bypass.

Councillors had been circulated with a letter from Inspector Whitehead sent to David Ruffley MP.

The Clerk said he had several conversations with PC Collins who was giving this stretch of road priority and some speeding tickets had been handed out.

b. Russell Baron Road – parking issues.

This matter had been discussed under item 4 Police Report.

c. Widening footpath.

Discussed under item 5 Borough/County Councillor's Report.

Councillor Butler said the Parish Council will be made to look ineffective on this issue, particularly should no funding be forthcoming from the Borough. He wondered if we should involve the local press? It was agreed to await the outcome of the decision by the Borough on funding which was due at the end of September. This would be an agenda item for October's meeting.

d. Youth Club.

The Clerk would chase up the issue of the balance sheet.

e. Barton Hill noticeboard.

The Clerk reported that the base for the board was to be put down on 10th September and the board erected on 12th September.

9. COMMITTEE REPORTS

SALC

It was agreed to enter the Newsletter of the Year competition
The invitation to the area meeting was received.
The email on parish polls reform had been circulated.
It was decided not to order the updated New Councillor Guide.

Village Hall

The minutes of their meeting held on 16th July 2013 had been circulated to Councillors.
Councillor Buxton said the Village Hall Committee deserved credit for the recent improvements which greatly enhanced the Hall.
She did ask if the fridge door could be reversed, making it more accessible. Councillor Hubbard said he would ask for this to be done.

Playing Field

Councillor Forster said the playing field was in good order.
The key to the gate was discussed. Mr Yates had offered to be a key holder as had the publican of the Woolpack.
Councillor Butler to whom he had spoken said this seemed to be an ideal situation. Councillors thought that it would be a good idea to ask the publican to the October meeting to discuss this.
Councillor Butler would invite him.

Tree Warden

Councillor Collier had asked the Clerk to contact the Borough regarding overhanging trees in Parklands Green. They would send someone out to see what needed to be done.

Rights of Way

SCC said they would attend to the overgrown footpath which runs parallel to the bypass.

It was noted that the rubbish sacks at the top of Old Hall Lane had finally been removed.

Mr Zarattini had emailed various issues. Councillors were given a copy of the communication.

The stile at the end on School lane required replacing. The Clerk would get on to SCC about this.

Other matters would be dealt with in due course.

M & TJ's had quoted £170 per cut for the paths as agreed with Councillor Collier. The Clerk had written to Guy Smith at SCC to make sure they would reimburse the Parish Council for the work.

Planning

The following were considered

SE/13/0969 Gamma Solar Limited. Provision of a single cable underground pilot/communications cable 6-87km in length between the proposed Ingham solar farm & the UKPN substation alongside the A143.

Councillor Mrs J Hubbard and Councillor G Hubbard registered their interest being connected with the gun club.

SE/13/0934 Mr Phil Martin, Erection of side and rear extension at Holly Lodge, The Street.

SE/13/0047 Miss Holton, 10 Hoylake Close. Erection of a single storey rear extension and first floor side extension, following the demolition of existing utility and conservatory. NO OBJECTION

10. CORRESPONDENCE

Various pieces of correspondence had been circulated and did not require attention.

Regarding the Parish Conference on 22nd October, Councillor Buxton said she would attend. The Clerk would book a place for her and for Councillor Collier who usually attends.

11. ACCOUNTS AND FINANCIAL MATTERS

The Clerk reported that Government had been generous enough to give parish clerks a 1% increase in salary after 3½ years on nil increase. Councillors agreed to this increase and to back pay to first of April 2013

Various other matters.

Councillor Mrs Buxton said we should send congratulations to Great Barton on winning the Village of the Year Award. Councillors concurred.

Councillor Buxton said that the geraniums in the planters did not flower this year. Councillors agreed to a figure of £50 for winter plants.

Councillor Buxton said the hedges on the playing field required cutting. The Clerk would ask Mr Rodwell and Heartwood to contact Councillor Forster to take a look and to quote for the work. Councillors agreed to take the lowest quote and not to wait to make a decision at the October meeting.

Councillor Butler said he wondered if the Bugle could be downloaded either by mail or via the web-site. Councillors felt that this should be looked into. The Clerk would make the necessary enquiries.

Councillor Butler thought contact should be made with the owners who own the bank alongside the footpath. In the meantime the Clerk would ask Mr Rodwell to cut the offending overhanging branches.

FORNHAM GARDEN CLUB

Sunday August 4th found some members and their guests heading to Elsing Hall, a moated manor house, situated near East Dereham. We were welcomed by the current owner who gave us a potted history of the building, set in parkland with many species of trees, which has been described as one of the hidden treasures of East Anglia. It is a private home with only limited opening, explaining why on a recent open day under the National Garden Scheme, in excess of 700 visitors 'invaded'. With walled, bog and Autumn gardens to explore first, we emerged through an opening in a hedge to be met with the magnificent sight of the front of the Hall, parts of which date back to about 1470 when it was built by the Hasting family. Fronting the Hall is the south terrace and the moat at its widest point, with four black swans to complete the idyllic scene. The deep perennial borders and the planting at the waters edge gave colour and perfume in the warmth of the sun.

What a delight when we realised the south terrace was to be where we would be served with our refreshments. Before we left we were invited to enjoy our picnic lunch in the park, which coincided with Elsing Cricket Club resplendent in their whites, practising for their match.

The gardens of Corpusty Mill was our destination for the rest of the afternoon and again we were welcomed by the owner. In his introduction he explained that the Mill straddles the River Bure with Corpusty on one side and Saxthorpe the other and mention of the Mill is made in the Domesday Book. After giving us a brief history of the buildings and in particular the gardens, we learned that the gardens in their current layout were designed, built and planted by two brothers, one being our host. For those who had enjoyed our previous visit in 2008 there have been many changes, but as memories do fade it was like visiting a garden new to us. Water of course featured highly in different forms, magnificent trees, many sculptures, a grotto, shrine, richly planted areas of perennials and much more.



Taking a break for refreshments mid tour we were able to reflect on how privileged we had been to be able to enjoy such contrasting gardens and in both cases to be the only visitors there. Again being a private home Corpusty Mill only opens for group visits by arrangement. The whole day was very special and for the cricket lovers being kept up to date with the rain affected Test Match, that was important too!

The popular plant *Salvia* was the subject matter at our meeting on August 13th and Janet Buist gave us an excellent talk to accompany her digital slide show. Janet began her Nursery about 17 years ago to assist in the funding of establishing a garden from scratch at her new house near St Ives and sold plants mainly at WI markets and the like.

Until 40 years ago only two forms of *Salvia* were known, the scarlet bedding plant, familiar to many and the culinary herb with its aromatic foliage. Some 900 to 1000 species now exist and are to be found on every Continent except Australasia. Plant hunters and collectors have had a field day! With annual, biennial, perennial and shrub forms, colours ranging through creams, blues, pinks and reds and a long flowering period, it is no wonder it can be found in so many of our gardens. Janet concluded with information and tips on propagation, pruning etc. before offering for sale the excellent quality plants she had brought along.

Our final outing of 2013 came on Sept 7th and despite a very mixed weather forecast we spend a dry and mainly sunny day visiting the Cambridge University Botanic Gardens, Docwra Manor garden in Shepreth, plus a bonus in the village of the Railway Crossing keeper's garden and a village gardener's display of begonias to rival many show stands, which he was very proud to chat about.

After such a glorious summer, recent high temperatures plus lack of rain and the fact we are approaching Autumn, it was to be expected that all the greenery were past their summer best.

However there was much to see and admire from the majestic trees in the Botanic Gardens, the various groupings of plants, colchicums and autumn flowering cyclamens lifting shady corners. Docwra Manor itself was mentioned in the Domesday book and the old barns were reunited with the Manor in the 1960's following many changes after 1922. This area has been redesigned as courtyard gardens, but the once magnificent buildings alone were worth spending time in as well as a stroll through the enclosed and semi-enclosed areas and their different selection of plants. A place with character, as was the small but full Crossing Cottage garden just 5 minutes walk away. Having lived there for 54 years the owners are used to the trains rushing by and have made a calm oasis which many of us enjoyed. All this and a tearoom called 'Teacake' - bliss!

The Garden Club meets on the second Tuesday of the month at **7:30 pm** in Fornham St Martin Village Hall. Membership; is £12 per year with visitors paying £2.50 per visit.

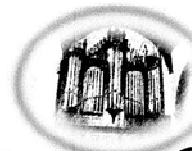


We had a very enjoyable Organ Recital Concert on 14th September with celebrated international guest organist Christopher Moore from Woolpit. He played various pieces, some well known and others not so, but entertaining, like Handel's Queen of Sheba, often used at weddings, Bach, Elgar, Lullaby for a Royal Prince by Arthur Willis (not for our new Prince George as it was written some 60 years ago) and a Geordie composer called Charles Avison. 35 attended from the Fornhams and surrounding villages and Bury, and with an excellent buffet and wine catering for 50, we were all well fed.

This was to launch our Organ Restoration Appeal, as it is in need of a thorough clean and refurbishment to reinstate some of the 1000+ wind pipes that are not fully functional. Initial estimates suggest some £10,000 will be required. It is now 101 years old, and has been installed in the Church for 40 years now, with little attention. Recently inspected by the Diocesan Organs Adviser it is rated very highly, and considered to be one of the best in Suffolk, so it is well worth preserving for the next 101 years. The funds raised from the recital were a good start, and our next concert on 2nd November by Tudor Rose Singers, with a small accompanying orchestra of friends of Christopher, will make this another entertaining and enjoyable evening. Afterwards there will be a buffet with wine, as usual. It would be nice to see a few more from the village supporting this community event and to really start generating the funds needed we are asking people to 'Sponsor a Pipe'. On **page 23** is a **sponsor form**, and if you can gift aid it then we can recover 25% back from the Government at no additional cost to the donator.

Our fortnightly Services in October and November are on Sundays, usually at 10am on :-

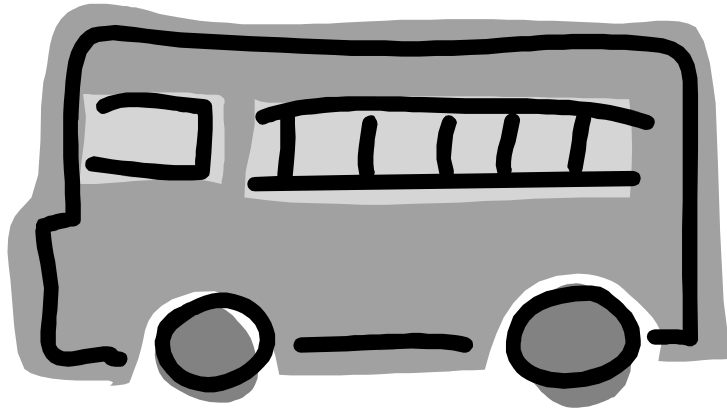
13th (Harvest Thanksgiving, 11am) and 27th October,



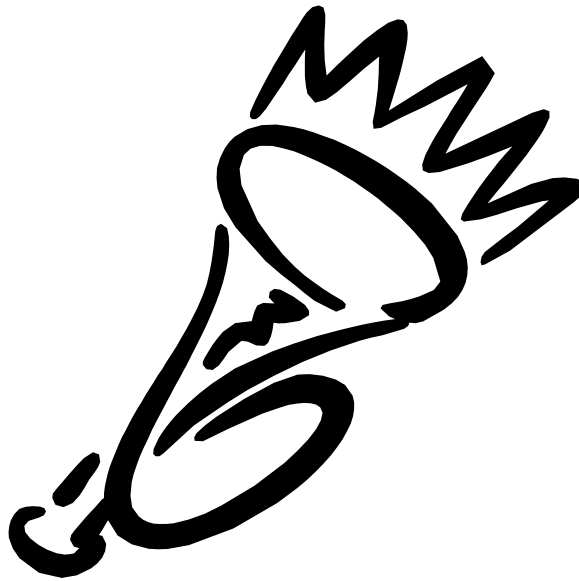
